Infinity Global Elementary School finally opened

Infinity Global Elementary School, which was developed by Kinder Kids, opened with their first entrance ceremony on April 11, 2022. The greatest feature of our school is the educational method that adopts eight unique systems such as multilingual education in English, Japanese and Chinese, subject-based specialist teaching system, project-based hands on learning, and financial education, and it's an unprecedented type of global school.

In these uncertain times, we aim to create "a School where everyone can be happy", as a guide for children to develop a strong will and to open up their future.



Motivation for school establishment

Our aim is to nurture our children to become bilingual and have an international perspective and a broad view of the world, under our school policy of "Japanese Spirit with an International Future".

Kimiko Nakayama, the director of the school, who experienced first-hand raising her children in a rapidly changing world, felt a sense of crisis that Japanese old education system may be left behind by other countries, and started searching for a school that was working on "how to help children develop the skills that only humans have" and "how to solve the problem of increasing truancy". But she couldn't find any. So she felt, "I'll make it if there isn't any!", with the same feeling as Kinder Kids was established. Kinder Kids opened the new elementary school in collaboration with Infinity Global School (Principle Otani). A school that has the same desire to change the common sense of the education system, and in April 2022, at the same time as elementary school, Infinity Global School opened the new junior high school. We together support global education that is linked from preschool to high school.


