> We are pleased to be starting this class at the request of our students who have already passed Eiken Grade Pre-1. The lessons will be taught in English only and will focus on all elements of the Eiken Grade 1 test.

Students joining the course will need to apply themselves even more than when they did to pass Eiken Grade Pre-1. At home, I mainly focused on solving past exam questions. It was very effective in getting used to the test format and the difficult questions. Also, I wrote down a lot of English words, which I like doing, and I found it helpful when memorizing many new words. I believe that spelling words correctly is very important to achieve a passing score.

#### What I like about Kinder Kids!

I learned the most from writing journals at Kinder Kids. My writing skills improved, by regularly writing English sentences. Taking spelling tests was also very beneficial for me. At first, I found it challenging when encountering unfamiliar words in the Grade 3 past exams, but as I increased my vocabulary through writing journals and taking spelling tests, I gradually became able to understand those words better. As a result of my effort, I am very happy to have passed the Grade 3 exam!

Interview

Interview What made you try the with Parents Grade 3 test during K2?

Based on the experiences of his older brother and sister, who are also graduates of Kinder Kids, I thought it would be more efficient and in line with the school curriculum to take the Eiken test in K2. Since writing the journal starts in K1 and the spelling test starts in K2, my recommended plan would be to take the Grade 5 to Grade 3 test in K2, then work on Grade 2 in K3, and Grade 2 in G1 to G4. I believe that Kinder Kids students will be able to handle this plan.

Interview with Parents How did he achieve a high score on the Interview test?

I believe that was due to the support of the teachers at Kinder Kids and the curriculum they provided. During the interview practice, they gave us excellent responses that allowed us to learn how to answer the questions. The reason he was able to achieve a high score was simply because the curriculum at Kinder Kids was perfect.

Interview with Parents I think some of the questions are difficult for young children.

It is true that some of the questions in the Eiken test require knowledge of world events and our society, which are difficult for young children to understand, but I believe it is important for children to experience the joy of discovering **new things through the Eiken test**. The quality of the Eiken questions is always very good, so even if you don't understand the meaning perfectly the first time, it would be good to start with "I kind of understand" and then change to "I understand perfectly" after solving the questions many times.

Interview with Parents Please give some advice to other parents.

Even if parents are not very good at English, it is important for them to think positively and enjoy learning together with their children. Initially, I could only understand basic phrases like "Good morning" and "See you," but before I knew it, I was able to comprehend most of the English conversations. The children's English levels will definitely improve, not only during their K2 and K3 years but also after graduation, so please stay positive and try your best!
